Once again, the council has been busy this past month working on various issues from agreements with Oklahoma County, Pottawatomie County, and Midwest City, to City zoning issues and much more.

Our search for a new City Manager resulted in the hiring of Matt Mears. Although he comes to us from Eagar Arizona, he is no stranger to Oklahoma. He is an Oklahoma native...born and raised in Yukon and as he started his City Manager career he served as a city manager intern in McLoud. He has family ties in the area given he married a local McLoud woman. They lived in the local area before moving on to Tonkawa, Tuttle, and then Eagar Arizona.

A big "Thank You" to Levi Dean for sitting in as City Manager during the hunt for a permanent City Manager. He did an outstanding job!

The City continues contract negotiations with the Police/FOP, we expect negotiations to be completed and approved soon.

Our roads continue to improve as we just finished the large and small crack repair to the streets in Redbud Creek and Cappella. This should extend the life of these streets and eliminate the need for overlay for many years. We are continuing to review our current street conditions and prioritize repairs needed with the funds approved in the FY2023/2024 fiscal year budget.

The Oklahoma Water Resource Board approved the loan to reconstruct the sewer line on Harrah Rd. as well as extend sewer along NE 23rd St. to the east side of the turnpike. The Harrah Rd. sewer project will increase sewer capacity to accommodate increased usage from the construction of numerous new homes and businesses. The NE 23rd St. sewer project will extend the sewer along NE 23rd St. to the east side of the turnpike. This will help attract business to the north side of our city. The city and engineers will commence designing the projects soon.

Harrah Public Schools will start back to school on August 10, 2023. Please be aware of increased traffic in and around our schools and obey the speed limit in the school zones.

PROPERTY NUISANCES

IT IS THAT TIME OF YEAR THAT WE NEED TO PAY PARTICULAR ATTENTION TO HIGH GRASS AND WEEDS. ANYTHING OVER 12 INCHES IS CONSIDERED A NUISANCE. IF YOU HAVE A NEIGHBOR THAT HAS LET THEIR LAWN GET OUT OF CONTROL CALL THE CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER AT 454-1203 AND GIVE HIM THE ADDRESS OF THE PROPERTY IN QUESTION. ALSO, BE AWARE OF STANDING WATER THAT HAS BECOME STAGNANT IN OLD TIRES OR SWIMMING POOLS, ETC. IT WILL BE A BREEDING GROUND FOR MOSQUITOES.

SWIMMING POOLS HAVE TO BE DE-CHLORINATED BEFORE DRAINING. IF THE POOL CAN'T BE DE-CHLORINATED IT CAN ONLY BE DRAINED INTO THE CITY SEWER.
