This newsletter is intended to provide updates to citizens of Harrah on current and future projects.

The council has been busy this past month searching for and interviewing candidates for the City Manager position as well as working on and reviewing the FY 2023-2024 Budget.

A very big thank you to acting City Manager (and Fire Chief) Levi Dean, Finance and HR Director Michele Cogdill, & all department heads for their hard work on the budget that we approved during the June 15th council meeting.

The City has been in contract negotiations with the Firefighters/IAFF and the Police/FOP, and we are pleased to announce that we accepted the IAFF Firefighter union contract at the June 15 council meeting. While the negotiations with the Police/FOP are continuing, we expect negotiations to be completed and approved soon.

At the most recent council meeting the Council did not renew the hazardous waste disposal contract with Midwest City. This contract for household hazardous waste disposal was of limited benefit to the citizens of Harrah. Very few could participate before the limits of the contract were reached. The city is searching for alternatives that will be of better benefit to our citizens.

The city is continuing to improve the streets/roads and we just finished paving Cabin Rd, Oakridge Dr, Hampton Rd, and Park St. More to come in the area of streets/roads given the City Council continued to fund improvement in the recently approved FY 2023/2024 Budget.

Thanks to everyone who participated in the 50th anniversary of Harrah Lions Park. The park was beautiful thanks to Friends of the Park, Harrah Football, and the many volunteers that spent countless hours preparing the park by planting, cleaning, and painting. All who attended had a wonderful time on the gigantic inflatable zip line, competing in corn hole toss, dunking the mayor and other city officials in the dunk tank, as well as many other events around the park.

What a great time in Harrah Heritage Park with Mountain Smoke! This was a free concert and they put on a great show that was well attended. Mr. Tony's, Fiesta Taco, and Shepp's BBQ served up the food for the event. Fun for all.

As we indicated last month, we continue to work the proposed sewer improvement project on Harrah Rd and 23rd St with the Oklahoma Water Resources Board as well as the Harrah Heritage Park design improvements. We will update you on those projects as they progress through the process.
